Role Outline and Responsibilities

A Marmalade Trust Christmas Day

Our guests wake up with a feeling of joy, knowing that they are going to be picked up by one of our kind and wonderful volunteers and driven to a restaurant to enjoy a meal in the company of others. For many this will be the first time in a long while that they won't be spending Christmas Day alone. They arrive at the venue and are warmly greeted and introduced to their fellow guests and made to feel a part of their own Marmalade Family.

The feast and jollity begins, with friendly volunteers and companions around them to chat to and share the celebrations. The meal concludes with offerings of gifts and their kind and wonderful volunteer drives them safely home. Here they settle down for the remainder of the day with a feeling of warmth and comfort, knowing that they have been thought about and cared for and made new friends.

At Marmalade Trust we're working towards alleviating loneliness and isolation throughout the year. Friendship isn't just for Christmas, but it's not a bad place to start! Thank you for considering volunteering for us.

Role outline

Driving Volunteer: As a Driving Volunteer you will be responsible for collecting one or two Marmalade guests from their home on Christmas Day and driving them to one of our host venues in Bristol, South Glos or North Somerset. You will return to collect the guest/s at the end of their meal and drive them home again. This role is suited to volunteers who can spare approximately one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon on Christmas Day.

General Volunteer: As a General Volunteer you will carry out the same duties as a Driving Volunteer, however, you will stay for the duration of the meal to support the Lead Volunteer with the smooth running of the event and help our guests feel settled, happy and most importantly, have fun! There may be space for you to dine with our guests, your Lead Volunteer will discuss this with you. If you'd like to eat we ask that you make a contribution towards the cost of the meal.

A little note about our guests

Our guests vary in age and ability but all would otherwise be on their own on Christmas Day. Many are of an older age, and as such may have health problems or limited mobility. It is also very common for our guests to be a little nervous, as many have limited social interaction, so they will require a friendly face and supportive and reassuring volunteers around them. We ask our volunteers to call their guest/s a few times before Christmas Day so you can become acquainted with each other. Getting to know our volunteers over the telephone can help ease any anxiety our guests may feel. It's also a nice opportunity to get to know them and share their excitement in being taken out on Christmas Day!

Role Criteria

Essential

- A car driver with a clean driving license
- Access to an insured car on Christmas day (25th December)
- An ability to assist the guests in and out of the vehicle and to and from the house/venue (training will be offered)

Non-drivers: We do not want to exclude non-drivers so if you do not drive or have access to a car and would like to volunteer as a General Volunteer please let us know as arrangements can be made to accommodate this.

Desirable

- A 5 door car and ability to take more than one member
- Space for a mobility aid – i.e. a wheelchair or walker – not all of our members will require this

Specifics of role and timings

Responsible to the Lead Volunteer

Where

We will do our best to match you with a guest/s that lives close to you. All of our venues are restaurants or pubs in Bristol, South Glos or North Somerset so you shouldn't have to travel too far.

There may be times when we change your designated guest according to need/location – these changes are often unavoidable and your understanding of these changes is appreciated.

Commitment required

Prior to Christmas Day:

- You will typically be informed of your guest/s name and contact details three weeks prior to Christmas Day. You can then call them to introduce yourself and discuss arrangements for collecting them. Our guests may feel a little anxious about going out (particularly if this is their first time), or have a slight memory impairment, so we ask that you call a few times before the day, and on Christmas Eve, to confirm arrangements. This is a nice opportunity for you and your guest to get to know each other. We know our guests particularly appreciate calls from our volunteers beforehand as it can help put them at ease.

Christmas Day (timings vary depending on venue but below is a rough guide to the commitment required):

- Collect guest/s at approx. 11/11.30 am from their home (depending on location/time required to support member etc).
- Support guest/s to your car – ensuring they have locked up the house; have their house keys/mobility aid and any medications required.
- Drive guest/s to venue and support them from car into venue. You will be greeted by the Marmalade Lead Volunteer. Driving Volunteers will go home and return later (on arrival you are welcome to stay for a drink). General Volunteers stay for the duration of the meal.
- At approx. 2.30/3 pm you will take your guest/s home, support them into their home and settle them in.
- Your job is now complete! You can enjoy the remainder of your day happy in the knowledge that you have enabled persons experiencing loneliness to have companionship and fun on Christmas Day.

Additional info

Several of our volunteers are people that would also be alone on Christmas Day, we therefore prioritise these applications.

If you have children, they are welcome to accompany you during the car journey, as long as this does not compromise your ability to carry out your role.
